IT HAS TO BE PERSONAL

We all grew up with the word “don’t”! Our parents, teachers, priests and others that we considered leaders and shapers in our lives, told us “don’t do this, that or the other”. The word “don’t” was often enough for the child and when the “don’t” was crossed there seemed to be a price to be paid. That said our response to and respect for the “don’t” was more than likely rooted in fear rather than choice, conforming rather than conviction and had little to do with a belief that it was the right thing. As we moved on in life, many of the choices once made for us had to be made on our own. We moved from ones guided by others to people who had to make our own choices.

I recently met a young driver, coming to terms with the first car and enjoying it. It was amusing to hear words around where fuel is cheapest. Months, never mind years ago, such concerns could not be further from the mind. When behind the wheel though, when the car is our responsibility and the filling of the tank hits our pockets, the “cents per litre” take on more relevance.

At day’s end, it has to boil down to my own decisions in and around life. In Gospel and Faith terms, my own choices around belief. The words of others, the “do’s and don’ts” may well fade but the daily and personal choices remain, in fact they become central. Others can only take us so far. The moment comes when the decision to be taken and made, is taken and made by the self.

That’s where Jesus is at with Peter this weekend. It’s one thing to know and be able to repeat what others are saying but the crucial truth and difference is found in one’s own awareness and response. “But you”, he asked “who do you say I am?”

TELLUS SURVEY

The Tellus survey, collecting the latest geological information across Ireland, is due to commence its next airborne surveying phase over counties Galway, Mayo and neighbouring parts of Roscommon, Offaly, Clare and Tipperary from early June 2016. The survey involves an aircraft flying at a low height (60m). The sound of the plane is similar to that of a passing lorry; however it may startle sensitive animals such as horses, pedigree cattle, sheep-in-lamb and poultry flocks. Ground sampling of counties May, west Galway and north Clare has already commenced and will run through to the autumn months. Samplers – who work in pairs and carry I.D. - will be collecting soil and stream samples. 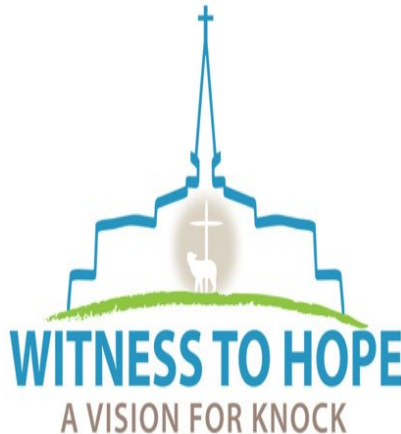
support local hospice palliative care services.

KNOCK SHRINE

The National Marian Shrine at Knock has undertaken a development programme called “**Witness to Hope**”. The programme has three core priorities:

- the renewal of Christian Faith through specific and tailored programmes, including a dedicated Youth Outreach
- promotion of the West and increasing the number of pilgrims visiting annually, to Knock and other important religious sites
- creating a warm and prayerful space in which to celebrate Faith with the refurbishment of the Basilica of Our Lady

Many dioceses, parishes, and priests personally have already given considerable support to this project

and responded to appeals very generously. The Shrine Office has now asked the Western Bishops to allow it to contact the parishes with a view to a second Collection in our churches over the weekend of July 2nd-3rd. After much discussion, the Bishops have agreed. Knock Shrine is very dear to the hearts of many people in our diocese and this may give some people who would like to make a contribution to the “Witness to Hope” programme the opportunity to do so. If you would like to support this appeal, and haven't so far had the opportunity to support the works already done and ongoing at Knock, you may do so next weekend. We will not pass around a second basket but invite you to place your contribution in an envelope marked “**KNOCK SHRINE**” and place it with your offertory donation. We will also have a bucket or box at the doors of the churches as you exit Mass if you would prefer to place a donation there.

VOCATIONS DIRECTOR

Fr Paul's work will focus on encouraging Vocations to the Priesthood within the diocese. 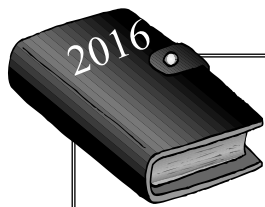
VISITATION OF HOSPITALS
