FR. J.T. CRIBBEN

During the past few days, we heard of the death of Fr. J. T. Cribben late of Carrabeg. He came home to celebrate his golden Jubilee on the weekend of 21st and 22nd July 2013, and, as he put it himself 'To thank the community that formed him and made him the man he was.' It is a weekend that lives on in our memories and now will be truly cherished. Fr. J.T never forgot his roots and especially Knock Shrine, which was a dear place to his heart. On the 23rd July, a very special occasion took place near Fr. J.T's birth place of Carrabeg, where there is a penal Mass Rock, he was the Principal Celebrant at Mass there and he was joined by Fr. Padraig Costello, parish priest of Foxford and Fr. Dominic Towey parish priest of St. John the Baptist parish in the Diocese of Motherwell, native sons of the Parish, it was a very special evening and he also shared that when he was a child attending Tavrane N.S, his teachers would bring the whole school to visit this sacred spot. He reminded us all that faith is a precious gift that has to be cherished and people had died for this faith in past generations, so that we could on that evening celebrate the sacrifice of the Holy Mass with freedom. As a community we would like to express our deepest sympathy to his sister Annie and his family and to his diocesan family, Bishop John Arnold and his brother priests on the sudden passing of a man with a very big heart, who loved his work as a priest and meeting people.
