BAPTISM OF THE LORD - 7th January 2018



As we reflect this weekend on the Lord's baptism, maybe that's the key word "reflect".

A baby reaching out to be picked up, drawn close and loved. In that reflection, we see the best possible version of ourselves - one bringing joy to those around us and open to life, innocent in the very best and most meaningful sense of the word and totally at one with God.

Let us reflect on our parents. Those who sought to bring us into contact with God and His Church. The very ones who shaped our lives, looked forward to our arrival and, through the years, made countless sacrifices in our name. Do we give ourselves time to ponder on what this means and the difference it would undoubtedly make if all of us played a central part - our central part - in "being" church.

READING GOD'S WORD

We are fortunate to have many people involved in proclaiming the Word of God at our weekend Masses. Hopefully we will add to that number in the coming weeks. A few pointers/reminders for all involved. It is recommended that we always read from the Lectionary rather than a missal or missalette. These should be used to prepare the reading. The word "Response" should not be necessary as it is hoped that the person reading would lead us in the response, having introduced us to it at the beginning of the Psalm. There is no need to say First Reading or Second Reading - it is better to just say where the reading is from, e.g. Letter to the Ephesians etc. We all tend to read faster than we realise so it's good to slow it down a little. Finally the reading should conclude with a short pause to allow time for what has been heard to rest with us and then "The word of The Lord".
