

orms are available this weekend and we will put form on Parish Website. If you donate $\notin 250.00$ or more during the course of the year (this is your combined donations to all collections for the parish, priest etc) tax can be reclaimed. Speaking with other parishes, this can be a significant boost to the parish at no additional cost to you. We can claim tax paid from 2017 onwards. The form asks for basic details, name, address etc and your PPS number. Details shared will be used only for this purpose and the form, once signed, is valid for five years.

This is not something we have done before though the option has been there for many years. If you are willing to become involved, I ask you to take a form, complete and return it. We will then look at our donations records and submit a claims form to Revenue. Again, this represents no additional cost to you but would be of benefit to the parish at this time as we look to the future and some projects that need attention in our churches. Thank you.




FIRST HOLY COMMUNION 2021
