HARITABLE DONATIONS SCHEME

There is a scheme in place whereby tax paid on donations to charitable institutions may be reclaimed by those institutions. Many parishes currently avail of this scheme but, until now, we have not done so in this parish. Given our present situation and looking towards future needs of the parish, it seems that this is an opportune time for us to seek funding from this scheme.

If your donations to the parish (Offertory and to the support of the priest of the parish) totals more than €250.00 per year, the tax paid may be reclaimed by the parish. This would be of significant benefit to the parish and would represent no additional cost to the donor.

There is a form to be signed by those concerned and this form will be made available to you in the coming weeks. It would be very much appreciated if as many as possible, with contributions in excess of €250.00 per year would sign and return this form.

Please give this some thought and when the forms are available take one, sign and return as soon as possible. This will be very helpful to the parish and will bring in some additional funding at no extra cost, funding we will need as we look to some projects that need attention in all our churches.

S WE RETURN

From Monday May 10th we will return to public worship. This is a welcome step on our road to normality and one that we take together. We will follow the same plan as before, with daily Masses divided between Kilmovee and Kilkelly and weekend Masses in the four churches. Daily Mass

will be at 9.30am and there will be two evening Masses (Thursday and Friday) at 7.00pm to facilitate those who wish to attend Mass but cannot do so in the morning. There is **NO SUNDAY OBLIGATION** at present so if you can attend Mass on any day during the week, please do so. This way, you will free up space for Sunday Masses for those who cannot attend during the week.

Our churches can take fifty people at any Mass, numbers beyond this cannot be permitted for the time being. Our previous experience suggests we will not have a difficulty with numbers, especially if people choose to come to Mass on different days. This worked well for us before and should do so again.

The number attending funerals has increased to fifty but there remains strong warnings against gatherings in homes for wakes or any arranged gathering after the conclusion of Mass or prayers at the graveside.

Baptisms continue to be celebrated with just parents and sponsors in attendance and gatherings after baptisms are discouraged.

We can have a reader at Mass and hopefully we will arrange a rota around this. If you are happy to be on that rota, please let me know.

Choirs and congregational singing are discouraged but we might look at putting something in place on a small scale. It would be lovely to have some music at our liturgies but we will have to work out the best way to do

As mentioned we hope to have First Holy Communion on June 12th but this will depend very much on keeping the numbers in the church below fifty and on avoiding any large family gatherings after the ceremony. This is not easy for families but is part of the journey we are on towards tackling the problem of spreading COVID-19. The goodwill of all is sought and appreciated.
