### 13<sup>th</sup> Sunday of The Year – 27<sup>th</sup> June 2021

There is little in life that compares with the sadness and worry around having a child who is sick. So often parents and grandparents say - "If only it could be me" - but, like so many other things in life, the script is not in our hands. There is truly a sense of helplessness as families strive to cope and offer comfort to one so loved and so ill.

The father in this weekend's gospel, represents all parents and families who have had to live through or are living through this reality. When he approaches Jesus and asks for help, he does so for all - "my little child is desperately ill" - is such a direct and urgent prayer. It does not fall on deaf ears.

Jesus goes to be with the family, but word reaches them that the child has died. Though it is suggested Jesus need not make the journey now, he continues the journey with the grief-stricken father. The script is not in our hands and Jesus knows that the end is not that described by the bringers of the heart-breaking message.

"Talitha kum" – little child, get up – is his message and call to the little one. Taking her by the hand, he draws her from sickness and death to the loving hands and hearts of her people. A miracle has been worked in the room of a family distraught.

Sadly, miracles of this dramatic outcome, are not always visible and unlike the family of today's story, many struggle to make sense of what is going on around them. The truth remains that Jesus does not cut short the road even when some feel the end has been reached.
