His message is constant.

Today's Gospel sees Jesus sending out his disciples with very clear instructions that they are to go where they are needed and proclaim the gospel.

If the message is welcomed, peace will flow from it and communities will build up. The message is vital and their role central to its delivery. His hope is that the message will indeed be welcomed but he knows too, that will not always be the case.

There will be times when the message will be met with resistance and indeed, hostility. Caring of his messengers, he tells them they do not have to take this and where the welcome is not sure, where the message is not received, have no hesitation about moving on but let the people know that it is known they have not been welcoming.

It is likely we are being asked to reflect this weekend on how readily we welcome God's word into our lives and hearts. Are we prepared to respond to it? Are we ready to be changed by it? Do we hear it as a welcome sound or an interfering noise?

How welcome would those early disciples have been in our community? Would they have set up home here or moved on? An old Abbey on a lakeshore, dating back to mid-1400s and four churches open and alive, maybe give us the answer.

Faith IS here. Thanks be to God.
